Take my hand each new day, stay beside me, don't go away.



From The Pastor's Pen As the elders and I take communion to shut-ins this quarter, we're happy to bring them your cards or other tokens of appreciation.

Just drop me a note about timing.

As the date of our Live Nativity approaches, I want to thank in advance our Mary (Lizzie Prigmore), Joseph (Mark Bischoff), and wise men (Butch Woodard, Dick Howe, and Jack Prewitt). Financial gifts from several other members, who wish to remain anonymous, made the event possible. Harrodsburg Christian Church has offered their mobile microphone, so that I may read relevant scriptural passages.

The community will explore our manger scene, talk with costumed members and our other friendly conversationalists. Large animals will be available to feed and pet. Warm drinks will be served inside Fellowship Hall. I hope the food truck I invited will agree to come. I'm working on finding musicians who can play in Fellowship Hall.

I invite each member and friend of United to consider a way to ensure a joyful experience for the community that evening. Engage visitors in friendly conversation? Help me place Live Nativity signs around the church, near the elementary school and in neighborhoods where many children live? Help me light and place tea candles for the 250 luminarias I've prepared? How about stand lookout as animals are unloaded and loaded? The company has asked the church to prevent eager people from petting animals until they are settled and animal supervisors give the okay.

Several of our shut-ins would like to attend, but need rides from Danville – anyone willing to transport Jack, Mattie, or Ruth, if family members are unavailable to drive? In case we need parking helpers, will you direct drivers to parking? How about selecting carols and making copies for the community to join in caroling? Would you share United's amazing history with anyone who expresses an interest? Be a tour guide through our decorated sanctuary? If it is cold, provide hand- and foot-warmers for our costumed folks outside? If it is rainy, bring your sports tent?

I checked with the police department, to make sure the Live Nativity will comply with city codes (it will). Upon meeting the code enforcement officer, and sharing our plans with him, he said he will bring his family. An activities scheduler at the Willows was excited to put our event on their bus schedule, as were facilities in Danville that are home to several of our members. I've given flyers to folks at the library, the newspaper, the ministerial association, and the Welcome Center. Next, I'll send one to the Presbytery's online newsletter. Please consider which of your neighbors has children and collect flyers from me or Jane. Then you can personally invite them, folks from your workplace or gym or favorite restaurant or wherever.


